
Swimming Sports

Attendance


A reminder regarding the importance of attendance. With structured literacy and numeracy programs in place, it is crucial that all students attend school every day to maximise their learning opportunities.

Thank you for your ongoing support and commitment to our school community.



Dear parents and carers,

Students have made a positive return to school this past week and I am extremely pleased with the care and concern everyone has shown towards each other during this difficult time for our community.

It's important to remember that the impact of the bushfires on the Halls Gap and Pomonal communities may extend over a period of time, and that we will continue to support students' mental health and wellbeing at school.

Following a natural disaster, children can get upset, feel unwell, and have trouble sleeping or concentrating. Everyone responds differently following a traumatic event: some may feel they only need support once it has had time to sink in. Information on supporting your child at home is available via the parents and carers tab in the Mental health and wellbeing toolkit.

If you have concerns about your child's mental health and wellbeing, please reach out to me at the school.

You may also consider speaking to your child's doctor who can assist you with a mental health care plan and provide advice on appropriate further support. Additional support is also available from the Kids Helpline (1800 551 800 or <u>kidshelpline.com.au</u>) or Parentline (13 22 89 or <u>parentline.com.au</u>).

It is also vital that we continue to acknowledge and celebrate our strengths as a community, and I encourage students and families to participate in the Casual Dress and Sausage Sizzle Fundraiser on Friday, 23 February.

Funds raised on the day will go directly to supporting the recovery of the Pomonal community.


All schools in the area will be fundraising to support the people of Pomonal and we look forward to contributing to this important cause.


If you require a new hat they can be purchased from the Front Office or on QKR for \$10.

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

Every Victorian child should have access to the world of learning opportunities that exist beyond the classroom. The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps ensure that no student will miss out on the opportunity to join their classmates for important, educational and fun activities. It is part of making Victoria the Education State and the Government's commitment to breaking the link between a student's background and their outcomes.

CAMPS, SPORTS & EXCURSIONS FUND (CSEF)

School camps provide children with inspiring experiences in the great outdoors. Excursions encourage a deeper understanding of how the world works while sports teach teamwork, discipline and leadership. All are a part of a healthy curriculum.

CSEF is provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. A special consideration category also exists for asylum seeker and refugee families. The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

The annual CSEF amount per student is:

- \$150 for primary school students
- \$250 for secondary school students


