
School furniture update:




Parent Choice School Approved

The parent has provided a reason (that is not a health, religious/cultural observance, or family holiday-related) and has sought and received approval from the principal.

Includes special circumstances, unavoidable causes, unforeseen circumstances, and an ill family member.

Student is a household contact of a person with COVID, is testing negative, but is kept away from school as a precaution.



Parent Choice Unauthorised (Unexcused)

The parent has provided a reason for absence (e.g., shopping, visiting friends), but the school does not consider this a reasonable excuse.

Parent is concerned about COVID exposure at school and decides to keep the student at home.

Approval has not been sought in advance or in accordance with school policy.

Conditions of approval have not been met (e.g., Student Absence Learning Plan for a family holiday not completed).



Extended Family Holidays

The parent has notified the school, agreed to a Student Absence Learning Plan, and the principal has agreed. For example:

Student is travelling with their family to see parts of the UK.

Student is visiting relatives in India with their family.


NAPLAN

Over the next couple of weeks NAPLAN will be running at the school. This is an important time for students to be assessed in their numeracy and literacy capabilities. As we know this is one test, taken at one moment in time for your child, in Grades 3 and 5. At Stawell Primary School we use a range of assessments to give a clear indication on how your child is growing and progressing in all areas of their learning. Our assessment schedule is constantly updated and administered to track your child's progress throughout the year. Although the data that is extracted from NAPLAN is useful at times, at Stawell Primary School we have a balanced approach to our assessments.

Pupil Free Day Friday 22nd March 2024.




If you require a new hat they can be purchased from the Front Office or on QKR for \$10.


