THERAPY DOG: LOTTIE

Lottie is a 2 year old Labrador cross Blue Heeler, who is a certified Therapy Dog. Whilst Lottie is at 502, she will be under the care of her trained handler and classroom teacher, Lisa. During her visits to school, she will provide support to students and staff in many different ways.

WHAT DO THERAPY DOGS DO?

Therapy dogs, like Lottie, are trained to bring support to people in many different forms. They can be used to help improve empathy/ compassion, self-esteem, social skills and behaviour. They can also assist students to improve confidence with their learning in a variety of areas, such as reading.

THERAPY DOGS FAQ'S

Are Therapy Dogs safe around children? Yes, Therapy Dogs (like Lottie) work with children throughout their training and have been temperament and obedience tested in a variety of settings, including around children, farm animals and with the elderly.

What if my child is allergic to dogs? Lottie is well groomed and bathed regularly. If we are aware that your child is allergic to dogs, all care will be taken to ensure they will not have contact with her during her visits at school.

Do Therapy Dogs disrupt the classroom? No, whilst Lottie is at school she will always be with the handler and will never be unattended. When she is in class, she will be settled on her mat in a 'drop' position, unless otherwise directed by the handler.

We understand that there may be some families who **do not** want Lottie the Therapy Dog to work directly with their child during her school visits.

Please email the school at stawell.ps@education.vic.gov.au to state your preference if you <u>do not</u> want Therapy Dogs in contact with your child/ren at school, or if you have any further questions.


