




Importance of Regular Attendance at 502






Looking Ahead: Next Semester and the School Review



We are excited to announce some changes to the Breakfast Club program for Term 3, 2024, and to introduce the new 'Their Care' OSHC program. We recently conducted a survey among parents, and the results clearly indicated a strong interest in having before and after school care available. We are pleased to welcome the 'Their Care' OSHC program to our school community, starting in Term 3.

'Their Care' OSHC Program

'Their Care' OSHC requires a dedicated space that is both welcoming and accommodating for students. Based on past success, we have decided to utilise the BER (Building Education Revolution) area for this program. This location has proven to be an excellent choice, providing a suitable environment for our students.

Breakfast Club Changes

To accommodate the 'Their Care' OSHC program, we have thoughtfully considered different scenarios for relocating the Breakfast Club. We are pleased to inform you that Breakfast Club will still be running and will now run out of the BER serving window. We will be purchasing new seating and other

resources to create a welcoming and inviting space for students to enjoy their breakfast (during Term 3).

New Breakfast Club Schedule

The Breakfast Club will have a slightly adjusted schedule to ensure students can enjoy their breakfast comfortably:

- Start Time: 8:45 AM

- End Time: 8:55 AM (late arrivals will be able to request breakfast if available)

This brief window will allow students to access a quick breakfast and have a pleasant space to sit and enjoy their food.

Staffing and Volunteer Support

We regret to inform you that Jackie, our current Wellbeing Support who runs the Breakfast Club on Tuesdays and Wednesdays, will not be available in Term 3. During this week's School Council meeting, we discussed the need for parent volunteers to help run the Breakfast Club. We are seeking volunteers to assist on Mondays, Tuesdays, and Wednesdays. Additionally, if anyone is willing to support Kylie on Thursdays and Fridays, it would be greatly appreciated.

When doing your child's enrolment there will be some information and documents that you will need on hand to complete the process.

These include

- Centrelink CRNs for yourself and the child you are enrolling
- Credit card or bank account details for direct debit purposes
- Emergency contact details in case you are not contactable in an emergency
- Authorised nominees for drop off and collection
- Doctor, Medicare, immunisations details for your child
- 6 Any medical or health details for your child




